Chef's Salad

Recipe courtesy of Cooking for 1 or 2
Quick, Easy, Satisfying

To julienne turkey and cheese, cut into matchstick-size pieces.

- 1 package (4-serving size) JELL-O® Brand Lemon Flavor Sugar Free Gelatin
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 3/4 cup boiling water
- 1/2 cup cold water
- Ice cubes
- 1 tablespoon vinegar
- 2 tablespoons reduced-calorie French dressing
- 1/4 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
- 1/8 teaspoon white pepper
- 3/4 cup chopped tomato
- 1/2 cup finely shredded lettuce
- 1/2 cup julienned cooked turkey breast
- 1/2 cup julienned Swiss cheese
- 2 tablespoons sliced green onions
- 2 tablespoons quartered radish slices

Completely dissolve gelatin and salt in boiling water. Combine cold water and enough ice cubes to measure 1 1/4 cups. Add to gelatin; stir until slightly thickened. Remove any unmelted ice.

Stir in vinegar, dressing, Worcestershire sauce and pepper. Chill until slightly thickened.

Stir remaining ingredients into gelatin mixture. Spoon into 2 individual plastic containers or serving dishes. Chill until firm, about 2 hours. Garnish, if desired.

Makes 3½ servings or 2 entrée servings
